

# BASTROP

On the banks of the Colorado River lies Bastrop, a city that combines a “historically hip” old-town charm with modern city comforts. One of Texas’ oldest communities, Bastrop boasts historic homes, a remarkable history museum, Main Street Historic District as well as special downtown districts for Cultural Arts and Culinary Arts. People come from far and near to spit off The Old Iron Bridge and then join the International Society of Bridge Spitters, followed by a short walk to check out Bastrop’s Farm Street Historic Chicken Sanctuary.

Known for being “East of Weird,” Bastrop offers recreational opportunities for all of Central Texas. The Colorado River winds its way through town to provide fishing, canoeing, kayaking, tubing, and stand up paddle boarding. Nearby, Lake Bastrop offers 900-acres of fresh water, full of bass, crappie, perch and catfish. Three local golf courses take full advantage of Bastrop’s natural beauty to create an unforgettable 54 holes. Numerous parks, hike-and-bike trails and other outdoor opportunities highlight Bastrop’s lovely countryside.

Shopping includes many homegrown businesses such as Texas Boot Company, Cripple Creek Wine and Gifts and Art Connections gallery. In addition, the community has attracted a variety of big-box retailers such as Buc-ee’s Travel Center, Home Depot, Lowe’s, Best Buy, PETCO, Staples, Ross, TJ Maxx, Academy, Spec’s, Ulta, and more.

Bastrop is one of only 19 cities to win a Cultural Arts District designation from the Texas Commission on the Arts. The Bastrop Fine Arts Guild is nearing completion of the Lost Pines Regional Art center, complementing the already thriving art scene that offers various art galleries. And if the timing works out, don’t miss the monthly First Friday Art Walk – the art/shopping equivalent of a pub-crawl.

Students and families will discover Bastrop to be a great place to get an education! Bastrop ISD, one of the fastest growing districts in Central Texas, is committed to providing outstanding instruction. The district is comprised of six elementary schools, two intermediate schools, two middle schools, two high schools, the Colorado River Collegiate Academy and an alternative campus. The multipurpose state-of-the-art Jerry Fay Wilhelm Center for the Performing Arts includes a 1,500-seat auditorium and a 250-seat black box theatre.

# ELGIN



Elgin's town motto is "Perfectly Situated." About half of its residents travel to and from Austin every day, which allows the community to maintain a strong connection to the vibrant Capital City activities without giving up many of the quality-of-life factors that attract people to Elgin in the first place.

Anyone who lives in Central Texas long, learns that floods can wreak absolute havoc in the region. However, the City of Elgin actually came about as a result of one such flood. Due to the need to redirect a railroad line that bypassed the Colorado River, the comparatively high elevation provided a perfect location for a train depot. The town's original plat placed the depot in the center of a one-square-mile area.

Elgin is a city with a vision that includes improving its quality of life by providing parks and recreation activities. With more than 50 acres of parkland within the city limits, residents enjoy a municipal pool, hike & bike trails, ball fields, disc golf and more. Elgin hosts the annual Western Days and Hog Eye Festivals, other special events and the historic beauty of Elgin make it a perfect setting for recreation.

Today, Elgin is famous for the two products it's been making since 1882: reliable bricks and delicious hot sausage. Three brick companies are still operating in the Elgin area. Elgin has also gained a national reputation for its hot sausage – three local companies produce more than 3 million pounds annually.

Elgin ISD ensures a high-quality education that guarantees a life-changing experience for all. The district is comprised of more than 168 square miles in portions of Bastrop, Lee, and Travis counties and provides educational resources to meet the needs of more than 4,100 students on six campuses, including three elementary schools, one middle school, one high school and an alternative campus.

# SMITHVILLE

The history of Smithville is tied to the coming of the railroad, which was the most important element in the founding of the town. Smithville was the dream of its entrepreneur founders who chartered the Smithville Town Company. The early residents of the town were industrious men who settled in the area to capitalize on the business the railroad would bring. The community was officially incorporated as the City of Smithville in 1895.

Recreational opportunities are abundant. On the bend of the Colorado River, Riverbend Park is the city's finest, offering walking trails, a fishing pier, an 18-hole disc golf course, and more. Popular destinations for bikers are the park roads of Buescher and Bastrop State Parks, connected by the winding, hilly 12-mile Park Road 1. Those who prefer more of a challenge look to Rocky Hill Ranch with more than 30 miles of world-class mountain biking trails. Buescher State Park is just over 1100 acres; activities include non-motorized boating, fishing, nature study, hiking and camping. The Smithville Recreation Center offers indoor recreation including a full-sized gymnasium, racquetball court, weight room, cardio room, lockers and showers. Just around the corner is the Power Plaza Skate Park, a concrete dream come true for those who skate. Smithville has always been a community minded town with a great quality of life and pure fun.

From the Front Room Wine Bar to the Back Door Café, Smithville's restaurant scene has much to offer, including the most recent additions of Honey's Pizza and Amy's Ice Cream. On the edge of town, the Smithville Crawford Municipal Airport is a publicly - owned airport managed by the City of Smithville. In addition, the community is home to Patricia Wolf Designs - a well-known designer of Western couture fashions - and the M. D. Anderson Cancer Center/Science Park Research Center. Its rural nature, small town quality, and artistic and eclectic personalities are key aspects of Smithville's character that residents value.

City leaders recognized the importance of education by creating the Smithville School District at the same time the town was incorporated. The exceptional Smithville Independent School District has five campuses and serves the community by equipping all students with the quality of education that prepares them to be successful in a changing society.

A wood gazebo and 12 concrete memorial benches compose the focal point of the park and a row of large crepe myrtles separate the park from the railroad. The adjacent Houston and Texas Central Freight Depot, circa 1870, has been restored and houses the Greater Elgin Chamber of Commerce and Visitors Center. A WWI cannon, memorial headstone and flagpole are located in the park. This popular downtown park is the site for many community events including the Saturday Farmer's Market, the Music in the Park series, annual Trick-or-Treat Trail and many more.
