Hamilton Creek Park

Located in the heart of the City and boasts lighted walk ways on either side of the creek, picnic areas, pavilion, gazebo, children's play area and fountains along the creek. Parking is accessed from US Highway 281 one block west of Highway 281 on Jackson Street.

Haley-Nelson Park

Skate Park

The Splash Park

Located just outside the The Y at the Highland Lakes, offers zero depth fun for the little ones. There is no fee for use of the Splash Park.

An 18-hole championship golf course in the heart of the beautiful Texas Hill Country. The course offers a pro shop, driving range, putting green, snack bar and dining room overlooking the number eighteen green.

Located in the Hill Country, Burnet CISD encompasses over 700 square miles and serves 3,200 students at six campuses. Burnet CISD has a rich history of excellence in academics and extracurricular activities and is committed to putting Students First. The first school in the town of Burnet was a private one taught in 1852 in a one-room log cabin. In following years school was conducted in the old Fort Croghan stone building. In 1885 the first Board Elections were held and six men were elected as school trustees. In 1970 the Bertram Independent School District was consolidated with the Burnet Independent School District to form the Burnet Consolidated Independent School District. BCISD has grown in size over the years. In 1990 the total enrollment of BCISD was 1,964. By 2008, it had grown to 3,452, but beginning with the economic downturn of 2008 the District experienced a steady decrease in enrollment which provided significant budget challenges. The current enrollment is 3,205 students. In many ways Burnet CISD is the heart of the Burnet community. Patrons and parents of the District are very supportive and can often be found at sporting events, assemblies, performances and celebrations hosted by the District. Burnet CISD has a rich history of putting students first.
