Amoco Park

1500 29th St N, Texas City

Spacious, fenced park with separate areas for large and small dogs. Obstacle course, benches, and some shade.

Bark Park at Countryside

501 North Bay Area Blvd, League City | 281/554-1000

This League City's Bark Park at Countryside is located within Lynn Gripon Park at Countryside. It is open from 7:30am to sunset everyday except Mondays. When it's closed on Mondays for maintenance. This park offers leash-free areas for dogs to run around freely!

Bay Area Park

Bay Area Park is a 64.3 acre park overlooking Armand Bayou. Among the tall trees you can picnic by the duck pond or walk along the flagstone trails and gazebo in the Oasis' garden. Launch your canoe and paddle along the historic Armand Bayou. There is a variety of playground structures, baseball and softball fields, and tennis courts. Bring your dogs and visit Precinct 2's first dog park.

Clear Lake Park

Clear Lake Park is a 59-acre park located southeastern Harris County. The south side of the park offers traditional park amenities as well as a boat launch and fishing pier, which is perfect for your dogs to run around and swim. The north side of the park offers playground equipment, various sports fields a half-mile jogging trail, community center and open air pavilion.

Little Cedar Bayou Dog Park

Off leash dog park with areas for both large and small dogs. Grass, trees, shade, a bit muddy, but plenty of room to run.

Lindale Dog Park

Fourth Street and Marine Drive, Galveston | 409/621-3177

Off-leash waterfront park with separate areas for large and small dogs, plus picnic tables, benches, and a children's playground.

Nassau Bay Dog Park

18900 Upper Bay Rd, Houston | 281/333-4211

The Nassau Bay Dog Park is located in Lake Nassau Park and has separate fenced areas for large and small dogs. Use of the dog park is at your own risk. Please abide by the rules to ensure the safety of you, your dog, and others visiting the park.

Sylvan Rodriguez Park

In 2001, the new park was named after distinguished journalist Sylvan Rodriguez, who resided in the Clear Lake Area and was an ardent supporter of the Challenger Centers during his lifetime. There is a jogging trail, a sitting ring monument, a picnic pavilion, practice fields and lacrosse fields as well as a rocket-themed playground. A great place to bring your family and pets.
